

Cookies Policy

UNLU Merchant Bank Limited (“UNLU Merchant Bank”, “we”, “our” or “us”) uses cookies and similar technologies on our website to ensure that the website operates securely and effectively and, where applicable, to understand how visitors use our website and improve its performance.

This Cookies Policy explains what cookies are, how we use them and how you can manage your preferences.

Our use of cookies and similar technologies is governed by applicable UK law, including the Privacy and Electronic Communications Regulations 2003 (PECR), the UK General Data Protection Regulation (UK GDPR) and the Data Protection Act 2018, where applicable.

1. What Are Cookies?

Cookies are small text files that may be placed on your computer, smartphone, tablet or other device when you visit a website.

Cookies allow a website to recognise a device and may be used to support website functionality, security, remember preferences or collect information about how the website is used.

We may also use technologies similar to cookies, such as pixels, tags or other technologies that store or access information on your device. References to “cookies” in this Policy include these similar technologies where applicable.

2. How We Use Cookies

We use cookies and similar technologies for purposes including:

- ensuring that our website operates properly and securely;
- maintaining essential website functionality;
- remembering certain preferences where this functionality is enabled;
- understanding how visitors use and navigate our website, where applicable; and
- improving the performance, content and functionality of our website.

We distinguish between cookies that are **strictly necessary** for the operation or security of the website and cookies that are **not strictly necessary**.

3. Strictly Necessary Cookies

Some cookies are strictly necessary for the website to operate or for a service requested by the user to function securely.

These cookies may be used without consent where they fall within the applicable exemption under PECR. They may include cookies required for website security, network management, session management or other essential website functions.

Because these cookies are necessary for the operation or security of the website, they cannot be disabled through our Cookie Management Panel.

We nevertheless provide information about the strictly necessary cookies used on our website through our Cookie Management Panel.

4. Non-Essential Cookies

Where we use cookies or similar technologies that are not strictly necessary for the operation of the website, we will obtain your consent before using them where required by PECR.

Non-essential cookies may include cookies used for functionality, analytics or other purposes.

You are not required to consent to non-essential cookies in order to browse our website.

5. Cookie Management and Your Choices

You can manage your cookie preferences through the “**Cookie Management Panel**” available on our website.

You can choose whether to accept or reject non-essential cookies and can change or withdraw your preferences at any time.

Where consent is required, we will not place or access the relevant non-essential cookies or similar technologies before you have provided valid consent.

You may also manage or delete cookies through your internet browser settings. However, disabling certain cookies may affect the functionality or performance of our website.

Your cookie choices will be respected in accordance with applicable law.

6. Third-Party Technologies

Where we use third-party cookies or similar technologies, the relevant third party may process information obtained through those technologies in accordance with the arrangements applicable to that service.

Details of the cookies and similar technologies currently used on our website, including their purposes, providers and applicable retention periods, are made available through our **Cookie Management Panel**.

We review the cookies and similar technologies used on our website periodically and update our information where necessary.

7. Personal Data and Cookies

Some information collected through cookies or similar technologies may constitute personal data.

Where this is the case, we will process that information in accordance with applicable data protection law and our **Privacy Notice**.

Depending on the circumstances, the processing of personal data associated with cookies may rely on consent or another lawful basis permitted under the UK GDPR. Where consent is required under PECR to store or access information on your device, we will obtain that consent separately through our cookie management mechanism.

Further information about how we process personal data, including information about your rights, can be found in our Privacy Notice.

8. Your Data Protection Rights

Where information collected through cookies constitutes personal data, you may have rights under applicable data protection law, including the right to:

- request access to your personal data;
- request correction of inaccurate or incomplete personal data;
- request deletion of personal data in certain circumstances;
- request restriction of processing in certain circumstances;
- object to certain processing;
- request portability of personal data where applicable; and
- withdraw consent where processing is based on consent.

These rights are subject to applicable legal conditions and exemptions.
